All painted up for Mystery Creek

Trimax is celebrating its 25th birthday this year, so some extra effort went into the company's display at the New Zealand Agricultural Fielddays at Mystery Creek, near Hamilton, in mid June.

The show continues to grow and with intense competition for exhibition space the Trimax team did well to secure the site next door to the one we have occupied for several years. A marquee covered the full width of the area to house tables and chairs, video screens, complimentary food area and other displays. The area in front of the marquee was attractively laid out with different machines including a Topper on a rotating display stand, and an Ezeemow, a Stealth and TrailMaster combination and a Pegasus Elite attached to tractors.
